The trouble with BaNES Council's Park and Ride plan

- The Council is misleading us because a Park and Ride on Bathampton Meadows will not reduce pollution or congestion
- Park and Rides generate more traffic, pollution and congestion
- Other cities are closing Park and Rides because they don't work.
 BaNES is not listening to the facts
- Park and Rides increase local traffic and attract people away from using buses. Instead they drive to a Park and Ride
- · Result out of town bus services are reduced or cut
- BaNES doesn't want you to know that their own data shows the 3 existing Park and Rides stand half empty most of the time, and that only 25% of users are commuters

What a waste of £9.7 million of tax payers money to build another!

- The extra Park and Ride will have no impact on high polluting HGVs. Lorries will still drive through Bath to connect with major routes e.g. A4, A46 and A36
- A new Park and Ride will have no effect on school-run traffic.
 Car traffic is much reduced during school holidays
- BaNES shows its lack of understanding and makes the situation worse by closing their Safe Routes to School team
- Building a Park and Ride on Bathampton Meadows will destroy an area of beautiful open countryside in the Green Belt, a working farm and the playing fields of a thriving rugby club
- Building a Park and Ride on water meadows defies common sense. It will increase flood risk locally and to the city

Even the Romans didn't build on this land! And..... it will not solve Bath's traffic problems

There are better ways of solving Bath's traffic problems

Recent research and data shows that Park and Ride is not the answer to city traffic problems in the 21st Century

- The council should make use of current research on city traffic solutions and its own data when making decisions about transport investment
- Existing Park and Ride capacity should be used first, by making improvements to signage, and visitor parking information available via council and tourism websites
- On the very few busy days when overspill parking is needed eg. Christmas Market, Rugby Games, University Open Days additional parking space could be used eg. Bath Racecourse
- Make the use of public transport more attractive.
 Improve frequency, reliability and punctuality of bus and train services.
- Reduce bus fares, thereby encouraging more people to travel to the centre by bus instead of the car
- Subsidised or free bus travel for school children
- Invest in more safe cycling routes
- Work with neighbouring councils and employers to find alternative solutions to reduce commuter traffic into the city eg. incentives to encourage car sharing

Public opinion is against a Park and Ride to the east of Bath. By early February there were 10,000 names on our petition, and the numbers continue to rise daily

There are better ways of spending public money!
