## West of England Transport Plan – consultation closes 19<sup>th</sup> December

We are now faced with a vision to 2036 from the West of England that sees the whole area becoming a huge transport hub. In addition to a P&R on the meadows, there are regional plans for a freight consolidation centre and the A46/A36 bypass. Plans for a Park and Ride are just the beginning and it is really important to send a message to this regional level that the Meadows are not for developing and that their plan must research and address the real causes of congestion without trashing our beautiful setting.

In the 2014 Transport Strategy, the Council agreed 'to establish the need for increased Park and Ride capacity as part of a wider parking strategy'. Funnily enough as they come towards reporting to Cabinet and moving on to planning, the Council has suddenly decided that now is the time to set about doing a wider parking strategy and are asking for our views.

## Cabinet decision – next year!

The council is no longer claiming it will make a decision on the Park and Ride this year, but they are talking about a decision in January. There is no scheduled Cabinet meeting for that month, but we suspect that the 28-day notice for such a meeting will be issued around Christmas time in the hope that we will all be distracted.

We are as confident as we can be that the council has not yet been able to acquire an alternative to site F which they already own; but that of course raises the specter of a return to site F if all other options fail. It's vital that we prepare the best case we can for Judicial Review and have funds available for continuing legal advice and action.
